Restoring Endangered Seabirds: Lessons from Puffins and Tems Dr. Stephen Kress, Director of National Audubon Society's Seabird Restoration Program, will review how techniques developed on Maine islands have led to the restoration of puffins and terns to historic nesting islands in the Gulf of Maine. Dr. Kress will also discuss how techniques developed in Maine are helping seabirds worldwide. His lecture includes reviews of several case studies in seabird restoration including restoration of Common Murres in California to an historic nesting island near San Francisco, relocation of a Caspian Tern colony in

Ļ	the Columbia River estuary to reduce predation on salmon smolt, and efforts to save the endangered Bermuda Petrel from rising oceans and increased frequency of hurricanes.


